15 Year Old To Ride Across Australia For Big Brothers

15 year old Gold Coast boy Jack Sinclair is well into his training to take on the Holy Grail of Australian ultra

"My dad (Brendon) does lots of cycling and I said to him it would be great to do what Ewan did, but across

Australia," said Jack.

Brendon's not so convinced.

"It's all a terrible mistake – I thought he meant ride across Australia on motorbikes and I thought I had a couple

of years before he got his license," said Jack's father Brendon.

"I've been trying to wiggle out of this but I gave my word – I'm 41 and just want to sit on the couch and eat

pies.....but he won't let me!" said Brendon.

Jack will use the trek to raise funds for disadvantaged youth via the Big Brothers Big Sisters Australia charity

(provide vulnerable young people, in need of additional support and friendship, with a caring mentor

and positive role model).
